

Cruiser Mk. ICS (A9CS) - 'A' Squadron Headquarters, 3rd Bn Royal Tank Regiment, 3rd Armd Bde, 1st Armd Div, Calais, 1940



Scout Carrier, unit unknown (possibly in 1st Armd Div), 1940



That this scout carrier belonged to 1st Armd Div I cannot confirm, thus the colour of the tac sign is also a guess. The centre is darker than the rest of the finish, the number white and the triangle light, but not yellow light.








Note: on this vehicle the 1st Armd Div formation sign only shows the rhinocerous and not the normal circular outline. Whether this was a single instance or the regimental norm I do not know.

Cruiser Mk. IV (A13 Mk. II) - '1' Troop, 'A' Squadron, 3rd Bn Royal Tank Regiment, 3rd Armd Bde, 1st Armd Div, location and date unknown



Bren Carrier - 4th/7th Royal Dragoon Guards (a divisional cavalry regiment), 2nd Infantry Division, location and date unknown





The national marking was a square between 12 and 15" of white paint applied to all vehicles. It seems to have



been not always applied. On tanks it was on the front hull, carriers both sides and soft skins the left front mud guard.
